A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN & CEO

2023 marked another year of significant growth, development, and indeed, change for Croí.

During the year, we continued to build out our services, activities and supports, and you will see many examples of this throughout this report, particularly with regard to our community facing activities, programmes and action focused on prevention and psychological supports. We have also progressed the patient empowerment and advocacy agenda with the formation of Heart & Stroke Voice Ireland, a new patient alliance under the auspices of Croí.

We must acknowledge the transformational legacy donation provided to Croí by the Joe and Helen O'Toole Charitable Trust (Tuam). This funding allocation has been a very important catalyst in enabling us to plan with ambition for a step-change in our levels of service delivery, geographical reach and impact. During 2023, this funding has enabled us to complete the design, statutory planning process and procurement for the new Stroke Hub located at Croí House, action the purchase of a community minibus and two bespoke mobile health units and begin the development of funded research activities in the area of stroke prevention and recovery.

We moved towards an inflection point for Croí as the organisation approaches its fifth decade and a significant focus was placed on strategy development and succession planning. Neil Johnson stepped down as CEO at the end of 2023, after three decades of exemplary service, and was succeeded in the role by Mark O'Donnell. Neil's dedication, commitment, drive and energy have made Croí the organisation it is today, and we wish to put on record the appreciation of the Board, Team, Volunteers and all of those who have benefitted from Croí services for his efforts.

In closing, we wish to sincerely thank our team and volunteers for their

exceptional work, and indeed everyone who has supported our efforts across the past year, through donations, sponsorship, corporate partnerships and fundraising events.

CROI IN THE COMMUNITY

In 2023, community engagement and activity grew strongly. The Croi Health Team connected with over 4.000 individuals across various communities providing health checks, talks, workshops and information stands. We reached people where they live, work, and socialise. Through innovative approaches and strategic partnerships, Croí ensured access to essential health resources and promoted wellness across communities.

During the month of May, Croí's Multidisciplinary Health Team organised special information evenings in Galway, Mayo and Roscommon to support individuals who experienced cardiac or stroke events. These gatherings featured expert talks on living well with stroke and heart disease and allowed attendees to connect, share experiences and build a supportive community.

Partnerships and Initiatives



Croí partnered with Basketball Ireland Masters Competitions in Kilkenny, Dublin and Galway, as well as Galway United FC and the Salthill Fives, 5 a side tournament. At these events, we provided blood pressure and pulse checks, advice, support and information on heart health and stroke prevention.



We also partnered with Uniphar Pharmacy Group to deliver blood pressure and pulse checks, as well as advice in 11 of their pharmacies across Dublin, Meath and Louth. We collaborated with local development companies like Galway Rural Development and education and training services like GRETB to deliver holistic health advice and supports to people in rural communities across our region. Our Workplace Wellness Programme saw us engage with businesses big and small across the country to train and support employees in heart health and stroke prevention. These activities underscore Croî's commitment to prevention, early detection, diagnosis and supporting people living with or affected by cardiovascular disease.

RTÉ Hospital Live

In May, Croí joined RTÉ's Hospital Live which was filmed live on the rooftop of The Mater Hospital, Dublin, Our team offered blood pressure checks to crew and lifestyle advice to viewers. Community Nurse, Madeline Rabbitt, discussed stroke prevention and the FAST campaign. Stroke survivor. Norita Ní Chartúir, shared a powerful story of her stroke, her friend's quick thinking in recognising the signs, F.A.S.T., her recovery, and had an emotional reunion with Dr. John Thornton. who saved her life that day.

CROÍ SPECIALIST HEALTH PROGRAMMES

Croi Connects

Croí Connects is our nurse helpline and signposting service. People contact this service for a wide range of reasons, for example:

- Advice and support related to heart conditions and stroke, particularly after hospital discharge
- Guidance for managing high blood pressure and cholesterol
- Exercise information and exercise classes
- Dietetic and weight management support
- Psychological support



The main benefit people describe of Croí Connects is that they feel listened to and understood. We received approximately 1,020 calls to Croí Connects in 2023.

Croí Connects 'chats' are free, weekly, online meetings where a member of the Croí Health Team or invited speaker share information related to managing risk factors for heart disease and stroke and facilitate questions and answers and discussion among the group. Each week, more than 50 people registered and across 2023 there were 2,254 registrations.

An online survey in 2023 showed that 84% found the information delivered was easy to understand, 78% believed the weekly 'chats' were beneficial to their health, and 62% reported making changes to their health habits as a result.

Healthy Hearts Programme

We have been working hard in recent years to develop different ways to support people to understand and find out about their risk for cardiovascular disease and to make important lifestyle changes to reduce risk. In 2023, we developed, and pilot tested the Croí Healthy Hearts Programme with 36 people. The programme is based on a self-directed online model involving weekly emails for 8 weeks containing a short video recorded by a Croí Health Team member, and a worksheet to support activity and practice each week. The programme targets people without a diagnosis of cardiovascular disease and aims to inform people and inspire them to take action and reduce their cardiovascular disease risk.



Psychological Support

Many people affected by heart disease and stroke, and their family members, experience distress, fear, and a sense of isolation. There is a serious lack of psychological support for people with cardiovascular disease. Although it is normal to feel worried and down after something like a heart attack, without access to appropriate psychological support, recovery can be more difficult. In 2023, Croí partnered with the Irish Heart Foundation to deliver a programme called ACTivate Your Life aiming to support emotional health and recovery. This programme is based on an effective approach in psychology called Acceptance and Commitment Therapy. In 2023, 23 people who had experienced a stroke attended the programme. Several family members completed the programme with their spouse or parent. In 2024, the programme will be opened up to people affected by heart conditions.

Stroke Support

For several years now Croí has been placing an increased emphasis on stroke awareness and services for people and families impacted by stroke. As a result of a generous legacy donation received in 2023 from the Joe and Helen O'Toole Charitable Trust, our stroke support activities have received a significant boost, enabling us to design and build a Stroke Support Hub at Croí House. This hub will be operational in early 2025. In 2023, we developed a half-day programme aiming to support people following hospital or community-based stroke rehabilitation called Rebuild and piloted it successfully. Focusing on exercise tailored to each individual, peer support, stroke and self-management information and guidance, and cognitive activities, the programme is intended to help reduce distress and isolation often reported after formal rehabilitation as people adapt to life after a stroke.

Third Age Mayo

Croí worked with IPSOS to survey 400 people in Mayo to understand attitudes and knowledge related to heart health. The survey's purpose was to gather information from a wide range of people to help shape the Third Age Project which focuses on empowering people over 55 to take action to reduce their risk of cardiovascular disease.

We conducted an analysis, with help from Professor Barry McDonnell of the Cardiff Metropolitan University, of data from 1,200 people in Mayo gathered as part of our ongoing Mayo Measurement blood pressure awareness activities. We found that many people have high blood pressure and are not aware that they may be at risk. Among people diagnosed with high blood pressure, it is common for blood pressure readings to be above the target level, meaning greater awareness and support to understand and manage high blood pressure is needed. Managing high blood pressure will greatly reduce the risk for heart disease and stroke.

In partnership with the Mayo Library Service, Croí launched an initiative to make home blood pressure monitors freely available to be loaned out by the public. Along with instructions for use, the monitors were loaned out 72 times in 2023.

Exercise

Over six terms in 2023, an average of 270 people attended exercise classes in Croí House every week. August marked one year of Monday Movers, Croí's community-led weekly walking group. Facilitated on a weekly basis by three dedicated volunteers, as many as 20 walkers gather at Croí House for a 60-minute walk – rain, hail or shine.

In October, 12 men linked with Galway Simon support services in Galway City joined a programme developed through a partnership with Galway Simon, supported by a Social Inclusion Grant from Galway City Council. Taking place over 8 weeks, the programme involved supervised exercise and health promotion information. The overall aim of the programme was to stimulate an achievable physical activity routine among the participants with a focus on long-term engagement in exercise.

HEART HEALTH CAMPAIGNS

Taking a multifaceted approach to our campaigns, Croí not only spreads awareness but also involves the community to encourage, empower and support healthy lifestyles, to save lives and fight heart disease and stroke in Ireland. We engage the community through educational workshops, free health check events, health fairs and partnerships with local organisations to promote cardiovascular health.



Men's Health Week 2023

Croí nurses carried out 352 blood pressure checks during Men's Health Week which took place from June 12th – 18th 2023 across Galway, Mayo and Roscommon. The Croí Walking Group and Walking Football participants took part in a series of videos for social media to highlight men's health and the importance of knowing your numbers and managing your risk factors.



Heart Valve Disease Awareness

One of Croi's notable initiatives is the "Listen to Your Heart" campaign which aims to raise awareness about heart valve disease (HVD). As part of this campaign, Croí conducts free stethoscope check events across various locations in Ireland, encouraging individuals, especially those over 65, to undergo regular heart checks. In 2023, Croí expanded the Heart Valve Disease Awareness campaign to four locations - Dublin, Mayo, Galway, and Limerick. Partnering with the Irish Nurses Cardiovascular Association and hospital cardiology and surgical teams, the campaign engaged over 1,000 people at the four events and had a reach of over 2.1 million through various media platforms.

This collaborative effort not only facilitated vital health checks but also amplified the campaign's reach through strategic media engagement, thereby significantly raising public awareness about the importance of early detection and management of heart valve disease (HVD). This initiative shows Croí's dedication to improving heart health and preventing heart disease and stroke. We do this by informing people, involving the community, and making healthcare services more accessible.



World Heart Day



Croí celebrated World Heart Day with 'Heartfest,' a two-day festival of cardiovascular health and wellbeing, in collaboration with the University of Galway and supported by AstraZeneca.

The event included health checks, wellbeing talks, fitness class tasters, CPR demos, and digital health stands. With support from a World Heart Federation World Heart Day grant, Croí co-created an educational video with 6th class pupils from Galway Educate Together National School who shared their top tips for a healthy heart. Landmark buildings in Galway and Mayo, including Kylemore Abbey and Ashford Castle, along with the famous Galway Hooker, were illuminated in red to support the campaign.

World Stroke Day



To mark World Stroke Day 2023, Croí hosted a community event in Tuam, Co. Galway, to raise awareness about stroke risk factors, symptoms, and support systems. The event, held in partnership with Community Health Care West and Surmodics, allowed attendees to interact with exhibitors offering health checks, relaxation therapies, technology demonstrations, educational resources, exercise sessions, CPR training, and more.

Croi Webinars

On June 1st and June 15th, Croí hosted two webinars which generated over 1,300 registrants, several hundred watch backs, and a host of new subscribers to our weekly Croí Connects email. As part of Croí's Invisible Nation campaign, our Spotlight on Cholesterol webinar focused on the role that cholesterol plays in ASCVD, as well as highlighting inherited conditions such as FH (Familial Hypercholesterolemia) and LP(a) / Lipoprotein(a).

Two weeks later to mark World Heart Rhythm Awareness Week, Croi collaborated with Get Smart About AFib website to raise awareness about Atrial Fibrillation, the importance of a diagnosis and the importance of managing/treating it once diagnosed. Both webinars featured patients with personal experiences and clinicians with expertise in cholesterol, lipid conditions and atrial fibrillation. Their stories and insights enriched the webinars and provided beneficial content for our social media channels. By sharing clips, quotes, and key takeaways from the webinars on social media, we extended the conversation beyond the live events and encouraged ongoing discussion and awareness with our online community.

These efforts enabled Croi to use social media to increase the educational impact of our webinars, reach a wider audience, and engage the community. This approach ensures that important health messages about heart health and





disease prevention are shared widely, supporting our goal of promoting cardiovascular health and wellness

Croi Courtyard Apartments

CROÍ ADVOCACY AND EMPOWERMENT

In February of 2023, Croí was a delighted to support the launch of a position paper by our sister organisation, the National Institute for Prevention and Cardiovascular Health (NIPC). This position paper was developed to identify and drive the healthcare policy changes needed to improve prevention and management of cardiovascular disease in Ireland, with a focus on atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease (ASCVD), heart failure and heart valve disease.

It sets out definitive actions for policymakers to prioritise cardiovascular health and take a preventive healthcare approach across the cardiovascular disease population, from early detection of risk factors in primary care to long-term management in the high-risk population – preventing heart attacks, strokes and hospitalisations, and ultimately saving thousands of lives.

On the 13th of June, Heart & Stroke Voice Ireland (HSVI), Ireland's first cardiovascular disease patient alliance, was launched in Dublin. The alliance, an initiative of Croi. was



launched by former Minister for Health, Mary Harney. Heart & Stroke Voice Ireland (HSVI) is a patient/survivor and carer led alliance of those living with or affected by heart conditions and stroke in Ireland. It has formed under the auspices of Croí to provide a platform for the patient and carer voice and to inform and support Croí's national heart and stroke advocacy agenda under one of its key pillars of Advocacy and Empowerment.

HSVI's advocacy extended through various campaigns from September to October, utilising print media, local radio, and social media to promote awareness. Notably, Rachel Nohilly's story on early detection of heart valve disease featured in the Irish Examiner and Irish Independent, amplifying the call for routine stethoscope checks during GP consultations.

HSVI members were proactive during the year on patient advisory boards, contributing to resources on cardiomyopathy and research on carer outcomes for stroke survivors. Their efforts were spotlighted in a World Heart Day supplement in the Irish Independent. underscoring conditions like atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease (ASCVD) and atrial fibrillation and stressing the significance of patient participation in cardiovascular healthcare.

In December, Croí and HSVI attended the European Parliament in Strasbourg where Croi joined the 'Vote Cardiovascular Health 2024' campaign by the European Alliance for Cardiovascular Health (EACH). The delegation engaged with Irish MEPs garnering support for a comprehensive EU (European Union) Cardiovascular Health Plan. Several Irish MEPs signed a pledge to support the establishment of an EU Cardiovascular Health Plan in the next European Parliament. Meanwhile, Croí continued its advocacy at national level, reinforcing our commitment to cardiovascular health at an Oireachtas Health Committee meeting. The focus was on issues related to cardiovascular health, stroke, heart attack, programmes, services and prevention. Croí CEO, Mark O'Donnell, highlighted the burden of cardiovascular disease in Ireland, the lack of a current National Cardiovascular Health Strategy, and the need for urgent action. He emphasised the importance of a patient-centric approach and shared insights into Croi's initiatives, including the establishment of Heart & Stroke Voice Ireland to ensure the patient voice is heard.

FINANCIALS



Croí's total income for 2023 was €2,400,000, of which €1,616,000 was achieved through fundraising, donations and sponsorships. In addition, €272,000 was received through grant support from the Health Service Executive in support of health programmes such as CLANN and the Mayo Third Age project. Furthermore, Croí received supports from corporates and community in the amount of €512,000 to deliver educational campaigns and vital prevention services to the community.

We expended 75% of our income on the direct delivery of a diverse range of health programmes including:

- CLANN our government funded healthy Lifestyle Intervention programme.
- Virtual exercise classes and stroke support.
- Croí Connects telephone support line and weekly online chat service, offering access to those living with cardiovascular disease to our healthcare professionals.
- Various Advocacy and Empowerment work in the area of health campaigns targeting those affected by Hypertension, Atherosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease (ASCVD) and Heart Valve Disease, specifically designed in response to the needs of our local and regional population and detailed throughout this report. The remaining 25% of our expenditure was expended on the costs associated with running the Croí Heart & Stroke Centre, the provision of patient & carer support accommodation at the Croí Courtyard Apartments and the overall costs of organisational management, governance, revenue generation and depreciation.

We take very seriously our obligation to ensure that all income is used effectively and efficiently in support of our mission and goals. We are governed by a Board of voluntary non-executive Directors who do not receive any remuneration or compensation

We adhere to the highest standards of governance and accountability having adopted the Code of Governance for Charities and the Statement of Guiding Principles for Fundraising.

Each year, our organisation undergoes an independent audit and we file accounts with the Companies Registration Office. We are also registered with the Irish Charities Regulator.

This year, our multidisciplinary team worked across the areas of Nursing, Physiotherapy, Exercise & Fitness, Dietetics & Nutrition, Diagnostics, Education & Training, Research, Fundraising and Programme Administration.

Each year, our staff engage with hundreds of stakeholders, from Courtyard Apartment visitors to healthcare professionals, collaborative partners, policy makers, patients, carers and volunteers.


